THE NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS ACT GIVES YOU THE RIGHT TO:

- Form, join, or assist a union;
- Choose a representative to bargain with us on your behalf;
- Act together with other employees for your benefit and protection;
- Choose not to engage in any of these protected activities.

WE WILL NOT interfere with, restrain, or coerce you in the exercise of the above rights.

WE WILL NOT fail and refuse and/or unreasonably delay in providing the Union with information that is relevant and necessary to its role as the exclusive bargaining representative of the Unit.

WE HAVE provided the Union with the relevant information it requested on November 22, 2023, regarding the grievance related to the termination of Jasmine Benson.

WE HAVE provided the Union with the relevant information it requested on December 29, 2023, regarding the grievance related to the termination of Kimberly Samuels.

WE HAVE provided, in part, the Union with the relevant information it requested on December 28, 2023, regarding the withholding of union dues, and **WE WILL** provide the information about: the reason for separation of the individuals no longer employed with SCR Medical Transportation; and, an explanation as to why double deductions were not remitted for the following members still employed with SCR Medical Transportation - Michael Brutlag, Shannon Coleman, British Copeland, Tinesha Murphy, Tom Schmerold, and Nastassia Luke Sanders.
